5. Pre-race requirements (checklist)

a. Anti-doping education program

All athletes, coaches, and support personnel must have completed the relevant anti-doping online course on the WADA Anti-Doping Education Learning platform (ADEL) corresponding to their role. The certificates showing completion should be sent by each National Federation to sue.natoli@canoeicf.sport. Previous certificates are still valid for this season. There is no need to repeat the program unless the person's role changes (e.g. athlete becoming coach).

Accreditations will not be issued until the certificates are marked off.

b. Entry list checking

Once the team leader arrives on the competition site, they must go to the accreditation office to check:

- the entry list per nation and notify any modifications
- the national anthem
- the national flag

c. Official training sessions requests

If any NF has a specific request concerning the official training sessions for a competition, these ones should have been sent by email to the technical managers: [Manon Bocquet](#) before the numerical entries' deadline (45 days minimum prior to the event). No requests will be considered after that deadline.

The ICF team will try to match these requests when building the official training schedule. Do not consider that a request sent will necessarily be done.

d. Guidelines for advertising on equipment

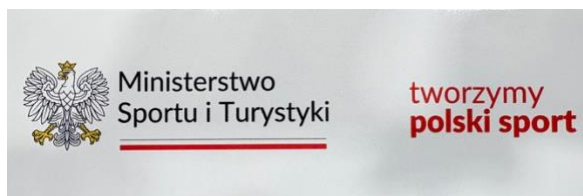
i. Generic guidelines

For canoe slalom boats, ICF Nation and athlete's name stickers are mandatory. Further information can be found in the [ICF guidelines for advertising trademark identification on equipment](#) document.

For Kayak Cross boats, only the Nation Sticker is required. It has to be placed in a suitable place in front of the cockpit. The actual location may vary depending on the model of the boat. The Nation sticker is the same dimensions as for the Canoe Slalom boats.

ii. Specific guidelines for the 2026 ICF CSL Jun & U23 World Championships

There are sponsor stickers to put on the boat. They will be available in the Accreditation office.



e. Technical Video Service

A TVS feed download solution will be available for all events and demonstration runs.

a) Cloud solution

The TVS cloud solution is the only way to access the TVS files. Each NF must register on the [2026 ICF Canoe Slalom TVS Management](#) form to indicate which person from the team will get access to the Dropbox folder for downloading the videos (one person per nation, one link sent for the whole season). Teams who do not register through the form will not receive the link, and they will not be able to access the TVS feed.

- To connect to the Dropbox folder, simply click on the link received by email.
- NF TVS manager can see the videos on the Dropbox website. All the files of a run (full run and gate line cameras) are available between 60 and 90 sec after the athlete crosses the finish line.
- To download the files locally onto your computer, or to see the files online, no Dropbox subscription is needed. The payment is necessary only if you want to store more than 2Gb of files on a Dropbox account.

No dedicated internet connection will be provided by the HOC. If the NF wants to secure a fast internet access locally, they have to manage their own internet access solution (4g/5G Sim card, Starlink...).

b) Backup solution

In case of issues using the TVS cloud solution, a backup option is available at the enquiry desk. There, the Nation TVS managers under the supervision of the ICF TVS manager, will be able to plug their own device via a RJ45 wire and download the files needed. Keep in mind that this backup solution is limited. Access will be granted for a short period of time, and priority will be given to NF's having athletes competing in the next competition phase on that day.

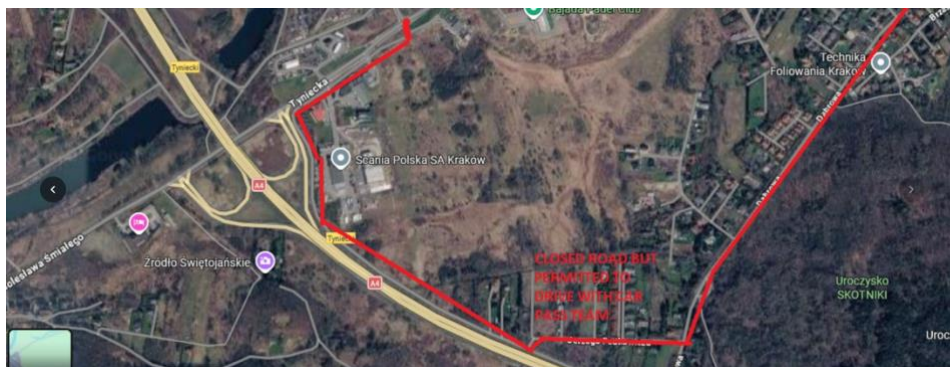
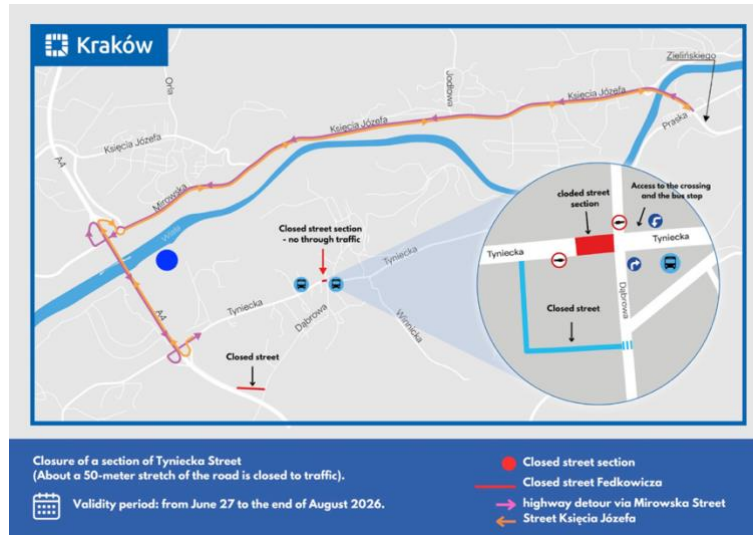
b. Venue layout

c. Venue access

Closed Tyniecka Street – in area where it cross Dabrowa Street

Tyniecka Street (street which is direct connection with city Centre from Kolna Venue) is closed from today during the whole competition term. Please see detour on the attached graphic. Detour is by Fedkowicza Street and Dabrowa Street. That road is officially closed but the city council gives Teams permission for driving there. Please make sure that car pass is in the car to avoid a mandate.



d. NF areas

- Opening hours of the NF area: from 07:00 to 20:00 from 25/06/2026 to 05/07/2026.
- Trailer parking: from 07:00 to 20:00 from 25/06/2026 to 05/07/2026.
- It is forbidden to add additional tents in the NF area.

Power distribution

- Please make sure that your electrical equipment is reliable and does not create any shortcuts or overload on the main network during the competition.

Wireless routers

Wireless routers must be outside the following frequencies:

- 5785 GHz, band width +/- 20 MHz
- 5825 GHz, band width +/- 20 MHz
- At no time should any wireless router system be connected to the computer which is connected to the TVS LAN cable

- Any team found to be using a device affecting the competition will have power removed to their compete system.

e. Equipment control

- Equipment Control for canoe slalom is located just after the finish line on the left bank.
- Self-checking is open: **Sunday, 28th June 2026 from 9:00 to 20:30 & Monday, 29th June 2026 from 7:00 am to 4:00pm**, at the finish area.
- Equipment control will be open each competition day 1h before the 1st boat starts.
- In Canoe and Kayak event and in Kayak Cross Individual: post competition control and random checking.
- In Kayak Cross Elimination, equipment control is located next to the start ramp in the start ramp passage and will be pre-competition.

f. Doping control

- Location: Sport Centre Kolna building (see point 16 on the venue map).
- Athletes will be notified for Doping Control in the finish area.
- **Passports** or **ID** are required for Athletes selected for doping control.

g. Enquiry/Protest desk

- Location: between ITO's room and Sport Information desk.

h. Medal ceremonies

- Location: at the medal tent (see point number 5 on the map).
- Schedule: see competition schedule, after each session of final.
- Athletes involved in the Finals for Canoe Slalom events should bring their national uniform to the medal ceremony preparation area. There will be boxes there to place the uniform in. There is only a short time between the end of the competition and the medal ceremonies.

7. Competition information

a. Official training schedule

- Canoe and kayak training sessions on **Thursday 25th till Monday 29th June**.
- Kayak Cross training sessions on **Thursday, Friday, Monday and Tuesday – separated between Junior & U23**. Two sessions are also planned on **Sunday 05th July morning**.

- Athletes only competing in Kayak Cross are allowed to train in both Kayak Cross training session, on Monday and on Tuesday Kayak Cross in their team group. Please refer to the list of athletes shared in the WhatsApp group.
- As at every competition, athletes competing exclusively in Kayak Cross are not permitted to participate in the slalom training sessions (including forerunner and free sessions). It also applies to canoe slalom athletes not competing in kayak cross, they are not permitted to participate in Kayak Cross training sessions.

b. Competition schedule

- The course is closed following the end of official training (Tuesday 30th June – 11:00) until the end of the competition– except for the Kayak Cross training sessions on Sunday 05th July from 08:00 to 10:00.

e. Course approval

i. Generic rules

The ICF wants to remind you that the course designers are:

- Selected from a pool of skilled people proposed by the NF,
- Are ITOs, which means independent from any NF during the competition.

Any pressure or kind of harassment towards the course designers, as for any ITOs, may lead to sanctions.

ii. **2026 ICF Junior & U23 Slalom World Championships course approval information**

f. Bib distribution

The full list of the bibs per event is available at Appendix 3.

- Training bibs will be available at the Hotel Kolna Reception desk [from 07:00 on Thursday 25/06/2026](#) and must be [returned \(all at once\) after last training session on Tuesday 30/06/2026](#).
- CSL and Kayak Cross Individual Competition bibs will be available at the [Sport information desk from 14:00 on Monday 29/06/2026](#).
- The accreditation fee must be fully paid to receive competition bibs.
- All Competition bibs need to be returned.

- A **100 euros deposit (cash only)** is required at the collection of the bibs and will be returned once all the competition bibs are returned.
- The Kayak Cross Individual bibs will be **collected right after each athlete's run in the finish line area**.
- For Elimination phases the **number and colour bibs** will be distributed **individually at the start area**. Then, the **colour bibs** will be **collected at finish line area**, but the **number bibs** need to be **brought back to the Sport information desk (all at once) after the competition** (the deposit will be given back to you at this time).

g. Opening Ceremony

Date: Sunday - June 28th 2026 8.00 pm

Meeting point: in front of the main bridge to the course

Time for meeting: 7:30 pm

Schedule:

7.30-8.00 pm: forming of the Athletes Parade in order, flags distribution

8.00 pm: start of the Ceremony, & Athletes Parade. Teams are going through the bridge to the island, parade is following the road up to the river to the medal tent area, flags are given to the volunteers in front of the podium and parade continue their walk to the tribunes – through the small bridge in the middle of the course.

When all Athletes reach the tribunes, official speeches begin and the Ceremony is run according to formal protocol.

8.30 pm -9.00 pm: entertainment program



h. Townhall reception

The Mayor of the City of Krakow invites representatives of NF (1 representative per National Federation) to take part in the official reception, which takes place on Friday, 3rd July 2026 at 7.30 in Wielkopolski Palace, Lea and Kupiecka Chambers (pl. Wszystkich Swietych 3-4).

Please take the invitations that was given to you in Accreditaion office.

Transport for that reception is not organized by the HOC. Access to City Hall is possible by taxi or by public transfer. The nearest tram station is Plac Dominikanski. To check the the Access from your accomodation locations you can use application:

8. Canoe & Kayak events

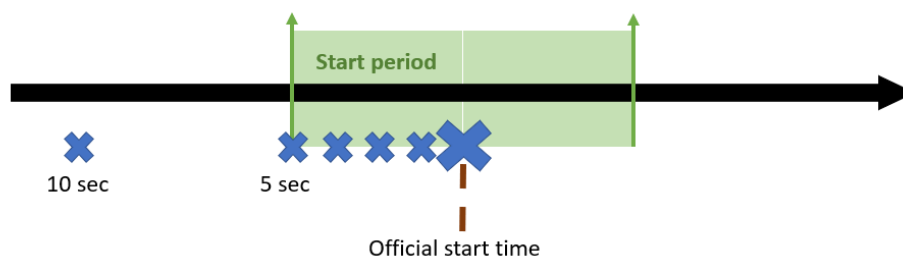
a. Pre-start procedure

There will be a **clock on river right** showing race time and the next athletes to start.

b. Start

i. Generic rules

- At all times, the athletes must follow the Starter's instruction, or they may be disqualified for the run.
- At the start, there will be a countdown clock showing the time to start.
- There will be an acoustic signal (10 seconds before start, and then from 5 seconds before start - 4 shorts, 1 long - start).
- Athletes may start 5 seconds either side of their official start time which is signified by the long beep on the start clock.



ii. Specific rules

- The starting boat must be **in the start blocks in front of the partners' panel, in front of the kayak cross start platform.**
- The beam line is **6m after the start blocks.**
- Athletes may move to the start position once the previous athlete has broken the beam but must be at the start position 15 seconds before their start.

- For the Teams Events the second and third Athlete should line up towards river left behind the level of the sponsor banner. Remember the first Athlete to break the beam should be in the Start blocks – can be “A”, “B”, or “C”.



c. Finish

i. Generic rules

- During the finals, the leading, the second and third athletes must proceed to the “Kiss and Cry” area located after equipment control where the leader will be interviewed.
- Athletes must not leave the finish zone until dismissed by the Equipment Control Official once they are no longer needed for the ceremonies, anti-doping or equipment control.
- They then proceed via the mixed zone back to the Athlete area.
- Athletes should wear their competition bib in the mixed zone for identification purposes.

ii. Specific rules

- The finish beam is marked by **banners on each bank**.
- All athletes must exit via the **stairs at the bottom of the course** to pass through equipment control, kiss and cry and mixed zone.

9. Kayak Cross events

a. Pre-start procedure

i. Generic rules

- Athletes need to be at the pre-start area prior to their start to prepare their boats (and equipment control during the Elimination phase), and receive any final instructions (color bibs distribution, choosing their start lane).
- Volunteers will be there to help your athlete if needed on the ramp.

ii. Specific rules

- Athletes need to go through equipment control in the **white tent in front of the start ramp, river left** (see point 2 on the map – START RAMP PASSAGE).

- Access to start ramp will be **from river left**.

b. Start procedure

i. Generic rules

- An automatic start machine will be used for all phases.
- At all times the athletes should follow the starters instructions.
- The start time for Kayak Cross Individual will be triggered by photocell.
- At the start, a Pre-Start Official will inform your Athlete if they have progressed.
-
- When an automatic starting mechanism is used, the athlete must start with both hands on the paddle, positioned alongside the kayak. The front hand must be placed over the middle of the boat on one side, in contact with the boat or the spraydeck.



- The start orders will be the following ones:
 - 1) "In position" => the athletes must place their paddle in the start position
 - 2) "Ready" => the athletes wait in steady position; no movement is allowed following the "Ready" command.
 - 3) The platform will tilt to indicate the start. The starter will not say "Go".

ii. Specific rules

➤ **Kayak Cross Individual**

- Athletes must start from **lane 2** on the platform (**second lane from river right**).
- The start interval is **45 seconds**; athletes should get in their boat directly on the platform.

➤ **Elimination phases**

- Athletes should be settled in the start position on the ramp 90 seconds before their start time.
- They should then listen to the sports presentation where they will be introduced to spectators.

c. Finish

i. Generic rules

- The finish time for Kayak Cross Individual will be triggered by photocell.
- During the Elimination phase a photo finish system will be deployed.

ii. Specific rules

- There is a different finish line to the canoe & kayak events – see map
- All athletes must exit via the **stairs at the bottom of the course** to pass through kiss and cry and mixed zone.

d. Rules reminder

o Kayak Roll

For the **roll barrier**, the roll must be performed by **going down on one side and coming up on the other**. During the execution of the roll, the boat must be **underneath the barrier for at least one phase of the action**.

o Dangerous Contact

In the case of dangerous contact, the judges will decide the penalty and one or both boats may be penalized

10. ICF topics

a. 2026 ICF JUN & U23 CSL World Championships Krakow – ITOs Kayak Cross briefing

The team leaders are invited to observe the ITOs Kayak Cross briefing that will be held on Monday 29th June (16:00 – 17:30 ITO Room next to OVR on venue).

b. On-site clean sport information booth

The International Testing Agency (ITA), in partnership with the ICF will provide clean sport education during the event. Athletes and Athlete Support Personnel are encouraged to visit the clean sport information booth to receive information and guidance on their anti-doping rights and responsibilities under the World Anti-Doping Code.

Educational topics will include the doping control process, the Prohibited List, understanding how to check medications, what is a Therapeutic Use Exemptions (TUEs) and how to apply for one, whereabouts requirements, the risks associated with supplements and food contamination and the principles of strict liability. Information will also be available on speaking up and reporting suspected doping concerns through appropriate channels.

The clean sport information booth will be open from 30 June to 2 July in the Athletes' Village, located within the Athletes' Lounge. Olympian and ITA Education Ambassador Simona Castro OLY will be available to answer questions, provide practical guidance and help participants navigate anti-doping processes and requirements.

The initiative forms part of the ITA and ICF's commitment to supporting athletes and their support personnel in making informed decisions, protecting their careers and contributing to a culture of clean and fair canoe.

c. 2027 ICF Ranking calendar

Applications are open through SDP until 1st of September 2026.

d. Injury & illness report

The ICF Medical Committee has developed a new [reporting tool](#) (Microsoft Forms) through which your athletes, team leaders, and team staff can report any injury or illness occurring during an ICF competition. This tool is available across all ICF disciplines and is fully anonymous and confidential.

The purpose of this initiative is to collect data that will enable the ICF Medical Committee and the ICF Discipline Committees to assess potential risks and implement the necessary measures to ensure athlete safety.

We would greatly appreciate it if your athletes, team leaders, and team staff could complete the form throughout the season whenever a relevant incident occurs. A poster will also be displayed at all competition venues for reference.
