

5. Competition Format

Note: The final of the ICF Ranking Race will consist of 12 boats per category (MK1, MC1, WK1, WC1).

6. Entry Process and Payment Method

Entries and accreditation for the ICF Ranking Race must be submitted through the ICF online entry system (SDP): https://icf.msl.es/icf/main.jsp

NOMINAL ENTRIES

Each competing athlete and team official must be entered by name for accreditation purposes by **14 April 2025**.

Entry Fee and Payment Method

- JPY 18,000 for Slalom race (includes the fee for official training, heat, and final)
- JPY 3,000 for Kayak Cross time trial (includes the fee for official training and time trial)

Payment must be made in Japanese yen cash at the venue. Credit cards and other non-

cash forms of payment are not accepted.

7. Hotel Information

Participants are requested to make their own accommodation arrangements.

8. Airport Transfer Service (Boat Transport Only)

For this competition, only boat transportation service will be available from Narita or Haneda Airport to the competition venue. Athletes, coaches, and team personnel are required to arrange their own transportation to and from the venue.

• Boat Transport Fee: JPY 5,000 per boat (round trip)







"Round trip" refers to boat transportation between Narita or Haneda Airport and the competition venue on the official arrival and departure days.

9. VISA Requirements

All visitors traveling to Tokyo, Japan, must have a valid visa for entry and stay.

10. Equipment Control

The Equipment Control area will be open for self-check as shown in the competition schedule (Section 4). Only a buoyancy jacket must be officially checked before the competition.

A failure to meet the requirement at the post-competition equipment control will result in DISQ-R.

11. Water Rescue

Water rescue personnel will be stationed along the course during competition hours only. Athletes must take full responsibility for their safety during official training sessions.

12. Athletes Services

The Host Organizing Committee (HOC) will provide the following services for participating athletes and team officials:

13. Doping Control

Doping control will be conducted during the competition in compliance with the ICF Anti-Doping regulations and WADA standards.

14. Victory Ceremony Protocol

The Victory Ceremony and Closing Ceremony will be held at the competition venue immediately following the conclusion of all events on Sunday, 27 April 2025. Athletes must attend the ceremony wearing official team tracksuits and shoes.
