How many Olympic rankings are calculated per gender?

Separate Olympic Qualification Rankings are calculated for each of the 6 Olympic events (MK1, MC1, MX1, WK1, WC1, WX1), which means an NOC may earn three quotas per gender.

How many quotas per gender can be allocated to an NOC via phase 1?

Based on the six Olympic Qualification Rankings, an NOC may be allocated up to three quotas per gender (K1, C1, X1) in phase 1, provided that each quota is earned by a different athlete.

Is an NOC not eligible to enter athletes in phase 2 if that NOC has already been allocated quotas via phase 1?

If an NOC has been allocated a quota in either Kayak Single or Kayak Cross in one gender during phase 1, that NOC can't enter any athlete in phase 2 neither in Kayak Single nor in Kayak Cross in that gender.

Apart from this, if an NOC has been allocated a quota in Canoe Single in one gender during phase 1, that NOC can't enter any athlete in phase 2 in Canoe single in the same gender.

Which NOCs are eligible to compete during phase 3?

All NOCs are eligible to compete in any event in phase 3 as long as they haven't been allocated a quota in the same event at any of the previous two phases. Additionally, only athletes of the eligible NOCs who have not earned a quota at any of the previous two phases are eligible to be entered.

Would it be possible to hold the direct Continental Qualifier before the locking of the Olympic Ranking?

No, the three phases of the qualification process are linear with the subsequent phases being built on the previous ones.
